ROMANS 10:9-13 Because,

Aif you ¹confess ²with your mouth that **JESUS IS LORD/KURIOS**

and

^{B 1}believe ²in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.

^{10 B}For with the ²heart one ¹believes and is justified, and

^{A 2}with the mouth one ¹confesses and *is* saved.

¹¹ For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame." For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same **LORD/KURIOS IS LORD/KURIOS OF ALL**, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. ¹³ For "everyone who calls on the name of the **LORD/KURIOS** will be saved."

Joel 2:32 ³² And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls on the name of the **LORD/YAHWEH/KURIOS** shall be saved.

LUKE 10:25-42

NARRATOR: And a lawyer stood up and put Him to the test.

Matthew 22:34-39

A lawyer, asked him a question to test him. ³⁶ "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" ³⁷ And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. ³⁸ This is the great and first commandment. ³⁹ And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

Luke 18:18-27 STUDENT

Luke 16:13 ¹³ No servant can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money."

NARRATOR: A ruler questioned Him.

He entered Jericho and was passing through. ² And there was a man called by the name of Zaccheus: he was a chief tax collector and he was rich. ³ Zaccheus was trying to see who Jesus was, and was unable because of the crowd, for he was small in stature. 4 So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree in order to see Him, for He was about to pass through that way. ⁵ When Jesus came to the place, He looked up and said to him, "Zaccheus, hurry and come down, for today I must stay at your house." ⁶ And he hurried and came down and received Him gladly. ⁷ When they saw it, they all began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to be the quest of a man who is a sinner." 8 Zaccheus stopped and said to the Lord/Kurios, "Behold, Lord/Kurios, half of my possessions I will give to the poor, and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will restore four times as much." 9 And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he, too, is a son of Abraham. ¹⁰ For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost."
