## Psalm 98

- <sup>1</sup>Oh sing to the LORD a new song,  
For he has done marvelous things!  
His right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him.
- <sup>2</sup>The LORD has made known his salvation;  
He has revealed his righteousness in the sight of the nations.
- <sup>3</sup>He has remembered his steadfast love and faithfulness to the house of Israel.  
All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.
- <sup>4</sup>Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth;  
break forth into joyous song and sing praises!
- <sup>5</sup>Sing praises to the LORD with the lyre,  
with the lyre and the sound of melody!
- <sup>6</sup>With trumpets and the sound of the horn  
make a joyful noise before the King, the LORD!
- <sup>7</sup>Let the sea roar, and all that fills it;  
the world and those who dwell in it!
- <sup>8</sup>Let the rivers clap their hands;  
Let the hills sing for joy together
- <sup>9</sup>Before the LORD, for he is coming to judge the earth.  
He will judge the world with righteousness,  
and the peoples with equity.

Eschatological Justice  
[underline “will judge”]

**Psalm 9:8** And He will judge the world in righteousness; He will execute judgment for the peoples with equity.

**Psalm 96:10** Say among the nations, “The LORD reigns; Indeed, the world is firmly established, it will not be moved; He will judge the peoples with equity.”

**Psalm 96:13** Before the LORD, for He is coming, For He is coming to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness And the peoples in His faithfulness.

**Psalm 98:9** Before the LORD, for He is coming to judge the earth; He will judge the world with righteousness And the peoples with equity.

**Psalm 67:4** Let the nations be glad and sing for joy; For You will judge the peoples with uprightness And guide the nations on the earth. Selah.

**Psalm 110:6** He will judge among the nations, He will fill *them* with corpses, He will shatter the chief men over a broad country.

**Psalm 135:14** For the LORD will judge His people And will have compassion on His servants.

**Isaiah 2:4** And He will judge between the nations, And will render decisions for many peoples; And they will hammer their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not lift up sword against nation, And never again will they learn war.

**Isaiah 11:4** But with righteousness He will judge the poor, And decide with fairness for the afflicted of the earth; And He will strike the earth with the rod of His mouth...

**Isaiah 51:5** “My righteousness is near, My salvation has gone forth, And My arms will judge the peoples; The coastlands will wait for Me, And for My arm they will wait expectantly.

Luke 17:22-37

<sup>22</sup> And He said to the disciples, “The days will come when you will long to see one of the days of the Son of Man, and you will not see it. <sup>23</sup> They will say to you, ‘Look there! Look here!’ Do not go away, and do not run after *them*. <sup>24</sup> For just like the lightning, when it flashes out of one part of the sky, shines to the other part of the sky, so will the Son of Man be in His day. <sup>25</sup> But first it is necessary/dei that He suffer many things and be rejected by this generation. <sup>26</sup> And just as it happened in the days of Noah, so it will be also in the days of the Son of Man: <sup>27</sup> they were eating, they were drinking, they were marrying, they were being given in marriage, until the day that Noah entered the ark, and the flood came and destroyed them all. <sup>28</sup> It was the same as happened in the days of Lot: they were eating, they were drinking, they were buying, they were selling, they were planting, they were building; <sup>29</sup> but on the day that Lot went out from Sodom it rained fire and brimstone from heaven and destroyed them all. <sup>30</sup> It will be just the same on the day that the Son of Man is revealed. <sup>31</sup> On that day, the one who is on the housetop and whose goods are in the house must not go down to take them out; and likewise the one who is in the field must not turn back. <sup>32</sup> Remember Lot’s wife. <sup>33</sup> Whoever seeks to keep his life will lose it, and whoever loses *his life* will preserve it. <sup>34</sup> I tell you, on that night there will be two in one bed; one will be taken and the other will be left. <sup>35</sup> There will be two women grinding at the same place; one will be taken and the other will be left. <sup>37</sup> And answering they said to Him, “Where, Lord?” And He said to them, “Where the body *is*, there also the vultures will be gathered.”

Luke 18:1-8

Now He was telling them a parable to show that at all times they ought to pray and not to lose heart, <sup>2</sup> saying, “In a certain city there was a judge who did not fear God and did not respect man. <sup>3</sup> There was a widow in that city, and she kept coming to him, saying, ‘Give me legal justice from my opponent.’ <sup>4</sup> For a while he was unwilling; but afterward he said to himself, ‘Even though I do not fear God nor respect man, <sup>5</sup> yet because this widow bothers me, I will give her legal justice, otherwise by continually coming she will wear me out.’” <sup>6</sup> And the Lord said, “Hear what the unjust judge said; <sup>7</sup> now, will not God bring about justice for His elect who cry to Him day and night, and will He delay long over them? <sup>8</sup> I tell you that He will bring about justice for them quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on the earth?”

Luke 18:9-14

<sup>9</sup> And He also told this parable to some people who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and viewed others with contempt: <sup>10</sup> "Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. <sup>11</sup> The Pharisee stood and was praying this to himself: 'God, I thank You that I am not like other people: swindlers, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. <sup>12</sup> I fast twice a week; I pay tithes of all that I get.' <sup>13</sup> But the tax collector, standing some distance away, was even unwilling to lift up his eyes to heaven, but was beating his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, the sinner!' <sup>14</sup> I tell you, this man went to his house righteous/made righteous rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Luke 18:15-17

<sup>15</sup> And they were bringing even their babies to Him so that He would touch them, but when the disciples saw it, they *began* rebuking them. <sup>16</sup> But Jesus called for them, saying, "Permit the children to come to Me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. <sup>17</sup> Truly I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it *at all*."
