THE RESURRECTION

The Gospel according to 1 Corinthians 15:3-4

That Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures

And that He was buried

And that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures.

1 CORINTHIANS 15:12-18

[Words in bold print are my explanation]

Problem: ¹²Now if Christ is preached, that he has been raised from the dead, how do some among you say that there is no resurrection of the dead [**for believers**]?

Reasoned answer:

A. ¹³But if there is no resurrection of the dead, not even Christ has been raised;

B. ¹⁴and if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is vain (**worthless**), your faith also is vain (**worthless**).

[You can't have a resurrected Christ if there will not be a resurrected you and

if there is no resurrected Christ, our preaching and your faith is worthless (vain)]

X. ¹⁵Moreover we are even found to be false witnesses of God, because we testified (**lied**) against God that He raised Christ, whom He did not raise, if in fact the dead are not raised. (**If there is not resurrection of the dead, then we have lied against God, by saying that He raised Christ from the dead, when He did not.**)

A. ¹⁶For if the dead are not raised, not even Christ has been raised;

B. ¹⁷and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain, you are still in your sins.

[You can't have a resurrected Christ if there will not be a resurrected you and

if there is no resurrected Christ your faith is worthless (vain) and we are still in our sins/unforgiven]

¹⁸Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished (there is no eternal life).

Luke 4:31-37

Jewish country

³¹ And He came down to Capernaum, a city of Galilee, and He was teaching them on the Sabbath;³² and they were amazed at His teaching, for His message was with authority. ³³ In the synagogue there was a man possessed by the **spirit of an unclean demon**, and he cried out with a loud voice, ³⁴ "Let us alone! What business do we have with each other, Jesus of Nazareth? Have You come to destroy us? I know who You are—the Holy One of God!" ³⁵ But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be muzzled and depart from him!" And when the **demon** had thrown him down in the midst *of the people*, he came out of him without doing him any harm. ³⁶ And amazement came upon them all, and they *began* talking with one another saying, "What is this message? For with authority and power He commands the **unclean spirits** and they come out." ³⁷ And the report about Him was spreading into every locality in the surrounding district.

Luke 8:26-39

Gentile country

²⁶ Then they sailed to the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite of Galilee. He was met by a man from the city who was possessed with **demons**; and...was in the tombs. ²⁸ Seeing Jesus, he cried out and fell before Him, and said in a loud voice, "What business do we have with each other, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg You, do not torment me." ²⁹ For He had commanded the **unclean spirit** to come out of the man. For it had seized him many times; and he was bound with chains and shackles and kept under guard, and yet he would break his bonds and be driven by the demon into the Wilderness ...³⁰ Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion," for many demons had entered him. ³¹ And they begged him not to command them to depart into the abyss. ³² Now a herd of pigs...on the hillside, and they begged him to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. ³³ Then the demons came out of the man and entered the pigs...

Temptation and the Christian

Luke 4:1-13

And Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness ² for forty days, being tempted by the devil. And he ate nothing during those days. And when they were ended, he was hungry. ³ The devil said to him... ⁵ And the devil took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time, ⁶ and said to him... ⁹ And he took him to Jerusalem and set him on the pinnacle of the temple and said to him... ¹³ And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from him until an opportune time. (Go to 5:16)

Luke 11:1-4 Now

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to

pray, as John taught his disciples." ² And he said to them, "When you pray, say:

"Father, hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come.

³ Give us each day our daily bread,

⁴ and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us.

And lead us not into temptation."

Luke 22:40-46

⁴⁰ When He arrived at the place, He said to them, "Pray that you may not enter into temptation." ⁴¹ And He withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and He knelt down and *began* to pray, ⁴² saying, "Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done." ⁴³ Now an angel from heaven appeared to Him, strengthening Him. ⁴⁴ And being in agony He was praying very fervently; and His sweat became like drops of blood, falling down upon the ground. ⁴⁵ When He rose from prayer, He came to the disciples and found them sleeping from

sorrow, ⁴⁶ and said to them, "Why are you sleeping? Get up and pray that you may not enter into temptation."

Luke 23

³³ And when they came to the place that is called The Skull, there they crucified him, and ...Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do...the rulers scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!" ³⁶ The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine ³⁷ and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" ...³⁹ One of the criminals who were hanged railed at him, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!" ... Then Jesus, calling out with a loud voice, said, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit!" And having said this he breathed his last.

¹⁸ Now as Jesus was walking by the Sea of Galilee, He saw two brothers, Simon who was called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen. ¹⁹ And He **said* to them, Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." ²⁰ Immediately they left their nets and followed Him. He saw two other

brothers, James the *son* of Zebedee, and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets; and He called them.

²² Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed Him.

Mark 1:16-20

¹⁶ As He was going along by the Sea of Galilee, He saw Simon and Andrew, the brother of Simon, casting a net in the sea; for they were fishermen. ¹⁷ And Jesus said to them, "Follow Me, and I will make you become fishers of men." ¹⁸ Immediately they left their nets and followed Him. ¹⁹ Going on a little farther, He saw James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother, who were also in the boat mending the nets. ²⁰ Immediately He called them; and they left their father Zebedee ...and went away to follow Him.

Peter and Isaiah: their call

Luke 5:4-11

⁴ When He had finished speaking, He said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch."⁵ Simon answered and said, "Master, we worked hard all night and caught nothing, but I will do as You say *and* let down the nets."⁶ When they had done this, they enclosed a great quantity of fish, and their nets *began* to break; ⁷ so they signaled to their partners in the other boat for them to come and help them. Isaiah 6:1-10

...I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, lofty and exalted... ² Seraphim stood above Him... ⁴ And the foundations ...trembled at the voice...while the temple was filling with smoke. ⁵ Then I said, "Woe is me, for I am ruined! Because I am a man of unclean lips,,, For my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts." ⁶ Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a burning coal ... ⁷ He touched my mouth *with it* and said, "Behold, this has touched your lips; and your iniquity is taken away and your sin is forgiven." ⁸ Then I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for Us?" Then I said, "Here am I. Send me!" ⁹ He said, "Go, and tell this people...
