Luke 19 and Visiting

Genesis 21:1

[*The Birth of Isaac*] The LORD visited Sarah as he had said, and the LORD did to Sarah as he had promised.

Genesis 50:24

And Joseph said to his brothers, "I am about to die, but God will visit you and bring you up out of this land to the land that he swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob."

Genesis 50:25

Then Joseph made the sons of Israel swear, saying, "God will surely visit you, and you shall carry up my bones from here."

Exodus 4:31

And the people believed; and when they heard that the LORD had visited the people of Israel and that he had seen their affliction, they bowed their heads and worshiped.

for peace! But now they
have been hidden from
your eyes. ⁴³ For the days
will come upon you when
your enemies will throw up
a barricade against you,
and surround you and hem
you in on every side, ⁴⁴ and
they will level you to the
ground and your children
within you, and they will
not leave in you one stone
upon another, because you
did not recognize the time
of your visitation."

Luke 7

1 Kings 17

Elijah went to Zarephath. And when he came to the gate of the city, behold, a widow was there gathering sticks. And he called to her and said, "Bring me a little water in a vessel, that I may drink." ¹¹ And said, "Bring me a morsel of bread in your hand." ¹² She said, "I have nothing baked, only a handful of flour in a jar and a little oil in a jug. And now I am gathering a couple of sticks that I may go in and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it and die." ¹³ And Elijah said to her, "Do not fear; go and do as you have said. But first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterward make something for yourself and your son. ¹⁴ For thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, 'The jar of flour shall not be spent, and the jug of oil shall not be empty, until the day that the LORD sends rain upon the earth.'"

¹⁷ After this the son of the woman, the mistress of the house, became ill. And his illness was so severe that there was no breath left in him. ¹⁸ And she said to Elijah, "What have you against me, O man of God? You have come to me to bring my sin to remembrance and to cause the death of my son!" ¹⁹ And he said to her, "Give me your son." And he took him from her arms and carried him up into the upper chamber where he lodged, and laid him on his own bed. ²⁰ And he cried to the LORD... ²¹ Then he stretched himself upon the child three times and cried to the LORD, "O LORD my God, let this child's life come into him again." ²² And the LORD listened to the voice of Elijah. And the life of the child came into him again, and he revived. ²³ And Elijah took the child and brought him down from the upper chamber into the house and gave him to his mother.

____A Prophet like Moses

How does Jesus satisfy all three according to Luke?

A. [Luke records in Acts 3 A sermon by Peter after Jesus' ascension]:
...²⁰and that God may send Jesus, the Messiah appointed for you...[of whom] God spoke by the mouth of His holy prophets from ancient time. ²²Moses said, 'THE LORD GOD WILL RAISE UP FOR YOU A PROPHET LIKE ME FROM YOUR BRETHREN; TO HIM YOU SHALL GIVE HEED to everything He says to you.

to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the descendants of David; and the virgin's name was Mary.

Luke 1:32

He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David;

Luke 1:69

And has raised up a horn of salvation for us In the house of David His servant—

Luke 2:4

Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David,

Luke 2:11

for today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.
