Ezekiel 43:1-5

The Glory of the LORD Fills the Temple

43 Then he led me to the *gate*, the *gate* facing **east**. ²And behold, the glory of the God of Israel was coming from the **east**. And the sound of his coming was like the sound of many waters, and the earth shone with his glory...And I fell on my face. ⁴As the glory of the LORD entered the temple by the *gate* facing **east**, ⁵the Spirit lifted me up and brought me into the inner court [of the Temple]; and behold, the glory of the LORD filled the temple. [Nehemiah]

THE CLUE TO HOW TO READ LUKE

Luke 1:77-79

[John the Baptist's father's hymn of praise]

⁷⁷ to give knowledge of salvation to his people

in the forgiveness of their sins,

⁷⁸ because of the tender mercy of our God,

whereby **the sunrise shall visit us from on high**

⁷⁹ to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death,

to guide our feet into the way of peace."

Luke 19

⁴¹ And when he **approached** and saw the city, he wept over it, ⁴² saying, "Would that you, even you, had known on this day the things that make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes. ⁴³ For the days will come upon you, when your enemies will set up a barricade around you and surround you and hem you in on every side ⁴⁴ and tear you down to the ground, you and your children within you. And they will not leave one stone upon another in you, because you did not know the time of your **visitation**."

Jesus Cleanses the Temple

Luke 19 and Visiting

Genesis 21:1

[*The Birth of Isaac*]

The LORD **visited** Sarah as he had said, and the LORD did to Sarah as he had promised.

Genesis 50:24

And Joseph said to his brothers, "I am about to die, but God will **visit** you and bring you up out of this land to the land that he swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob."

Genesis 50:25

Then Joseph made the sons of Israel swear, saying, "God will surely **visit** you, and you shall carry up my bones from here."

Exodus 4:31

And the people believed; and when they heard that the LORD had **visited** the people of Israel and that he had seen their affliction, they bowed their heads and worshiped.

Exodus 13:19

Moses took the bones of Joseph with him, for Joseph had made the sons of Israel solemnly swear, saying, "God will surely **visit** you, and you shall carry up my bones with you from here."

Ruth 1:6

[*Ruth's Loyalty to Naomi*] Then she arose with her daughters-in-law to return from the country of Moab, for she had heard in the fields of Moab that the LORD had **visited** his people and given them food.

1 Samuel 2:21

Indeed the LORD **visited** Hannah, and she conceived and bore three sons and two daughters. And the boy Samuel grew in the presence of the LORD.

Isaiah 29:6

you will be **visited** by the LORD of hosts with thunder and with earthquake and great noise, with whirlwind and tempest, and the flame of a devouring fire.

Jeremiah 27:22

They shall be carried to Babylon and remain there until the day when I **visit** them, declares the LORD. Then I will bring them back and restore them to this place."

Jeremiah 29:10

"For thus says the LORD: When seventy years are completed for Babylon, I will **visit** you, and I will fulfill to you my promise and bring you back to this place.
