Psalm 34:4-6

- A. <sup>4</sup> I **sought** Yahweh,
- B. and He **heard** me,
- C. and **delivered** me from **all** my fears.

- A. <sup>5</sup> They **looked** unto Him
- B. and were lightened:
- C. and their faces were no longer dark (red with shame).

- A. <sup>6</sup> This poor man **cried**,
- B. and Yahweh **heard** him,
- C. and **saved** him out of **all** his troubles

Luke 9:43b-50

But while everyone was marveling at all that He was doing, He said to His disciples, <sup>44</sup> "Let these words sink into your ears; for the Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men." <sup>45</sup> But they did not understand this statement, and it was concealed from them so that they would not perceive it; and they were afraid to ask Him about this statement. <sup>46</sup> An argument started among them as to which of them might be the greatest. <sup>47</sup> But Jesus, knowing what they were thinking in their heart, took a child and stood him by His side, <sup>48</sup> and said to them, "Whoever receives this child in My name receives Me, and whoever receives Me receives Him who sent Me; for the one who is least among all of you, this is the one who is great."

Luke 22:19-27

<sup>19</sup> And when He had taken *some* bread *and* given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me." <sup>20</sup> And in the same way *He took* the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood. <sup>21</sup> But behold, the hand of the one betraying Me is with Mine on the table. <sup>22</sup> For indeed, the Son of Man is going as it has been determined; but woe to that man by whom He is betrayed!" <sup>23</sup> And they began to discuss among themselves which one of them it might be who was going to do this thing.

<sup>24</sup> And there arose also a dispute among them *as to* which one of them was regarded to be greatest. <sup>25</sup> And He said to them, "The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those who have authority over them are called 'Benefactors.' <sup>26</sup> But *it is* not this way with you, but the one who is the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like the servant. <sup>27</sup> For who is greater, the one who reclines *at the table* or the one who serves? Is it not the one who reclines *at the table*? But I am among you as the one who serves.

Luke 22:39-46

<sup>39</sup> And He came out and proceeded as was His custom to the Mount of Olives; and the disciples also followed Him. <sup>40</sup> When He arrived at the place, He said to them, “**Pray that you may not enter into temptation.**”

<sup>41</sup> And He withdrew from them about a stone’s throw, and He knelt down and *began* to **pray**,

<sup>42</sup> saying, “Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done.” <sup>43</sup> Now an angel from heaven appeared to Him, strengthening Him. <sup>44</sup> And being in agony He was **praying** very fervently; and His sweat became like drops of blood, falling down upon the ground.

<sup>45</sup> When He rose from **prayer**, He came to the disciples and found them sleeping from sorrow,

<sup>46</sup> and said to them, “Why are you sleeping? Get up and **pray that you may not enter into temptation.**”

Luke 22:39-46

<sup>39</sup> And He came out and proceeded as was His custom to the Mount of Olives; and the disciples also followed Him. <sup>40</sup> When He arrived at the place, He said to them, "Pray that you may not enter into temptation." <sup>41</sup> And He withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and He knelt down and *began* to pray, <sup>42</sup> saying, "Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done." <sup>43</sup> Now an angel from heaven appeared to Him, strengthening Him. <sup>44</sup> And being in agony He was praying very fervently; and His sweat became like drops of blood, falling down upon the ground. <sup>45</sup> When He rose from prayer, He came to the disciples and found them sleeping from sorrow, <sup>46</sup> and said to them, "Why are you sleeping? Mark 14:32-52

32 They came to a place named Gethsemane; and He said to His disciples, "Sit here until I have prayed."  
33 And He took with Him Peter and James and John, and began to be very distressed and troubled.  
34 And He said to them, "My soul is deeply grieved to the point of death; remain here and stay awake." 35 And He went a little beyond them, and fell to the ground and began to pray that if it were possible, the hour might pass Him by. 36 And He was saying, "Abba! Father! All things are possible for You; remove this cup from Me; yet not what I will, but what You will." 37 And He came and found them sleeping, and said to Peter, "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not stay awake for one hour?  
38 Keep stay awake, and praying that you may not come into temptation; the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." 39 Again He went away and prayed, saying the same words. 40 And again He came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were very heavy; and they did not know what to answer Him. 41 And He came the third time, and said to them, "Are you still sleeping and resting? It is enough; the hour has come; behold, the Son of Man is being betrayed/handed over into the hands of sinners. 42 Get up, let us be going; behold, the one who betrays/Hands Me over is at hand!"
