And the LORD appeared to him the same night and said, “**I am** the God of Abraham **your** father. Fear not, for **I am with you...**

Genesis 28:15

LUKE AND DANIEL: A SECOND LOOK

DANIEL

9:20-21 Now while I was speaking and praying, and confessing my sin and the sin of my people Israel, and presenting my supplication before the LORD my God in behalf of the holy mountain (the temple and Jerusalem) of My God, while I was still speaking in prayer, then the man Gabriel, whom I had seen in the vision previously, came to me in my extreme weariness about the time of the evening offering.

8:17 So Gabriel came near to where I was standing, and when he came I was frightened and fell on my face; but he said to me, "...the vision pertains to the time of the end." 10:12 Then Gabriel said to me, "Do not be afraid, Daniel..." 10:18 Then Gabriel said, "O man of high esteem, do not be afraid. Peace be with you..."

7:16 I approached one of those who were standing by [the Ancient of Days]... 10:11 [Gabriel] said to me, "O Daniel, man of high esteem, understand the words that I am about to tell you and stand upright, for I have now been sent to you."

10:15 When Gabriel had spoken to me according to these words, I turned my face toward the ground and became speechless.

ZACHARIAS

1:9-10 According to the custom of the priestly office, Zacharias was chosen by lot to enter the temple of the Lord and burn incense. And the whole multitude of the people were in prayer outside at the hour of the incense offering.

1:12-13 Zacharias was troubled when he saw the angel (Gabriel), and fear gripped him. But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zacharias, for your petition has been heard..."

1:19 The angel answered and said to him, "I am Gabriel, who stands in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to bring you this good news."

1:20^a GABRIEL: And behold, you shall be silent and unable to speak until the day when these things take place...

³⁹ And He came out and proceeded as was His custom to the Mount of Olives; and the disciples also followed Him. ⁴⁰ When He arrived at the place, He said to them, "Pray that you may not be led into temptation." ⁴¹ And He withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and He knelt down and *began* to pray, ⁴² saying, "Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done." ⁴³ Now an angel from heaven appeared to Him, strengthening Him. ⁴⁴ And being in agony He was praying very fervently; and His sweat became like drops of blood, falling down upon the ground. ⁴⁵ When He rose from prayer, He came to the disciples and found them sleeping from sorrow, ⁴⁶ and said to them, "Why are you sleeping? ³² They came to a place named Gethsemane; and He said to His disciples, "Sit here until I have prayed."
³³ And He took with Him Peter and James and John, and began to be very distressed and troubled.
³⁴ And He said to them, "My soul is deeply grieved to the point of death; remain here and stay awake." ³⁵ And He went a little beyond them, and fell to the ground and began to pray that if it were possible, the hour might pass Him by. ³⁶ And He was saying, "Abba! Father! All things are possible for You; remove this cup from Me; yet not what I will, but what You will." ³⁷ And He came and found them sleeping, and said to Peter, "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not stay awake for one hour?"
³⁸ Keep stay awake, and praying that you may not come into temptation; the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." ³⁹ Again He went away and prayed, saying the same words. ⁴⁰ And again He came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were very heavy; and they did not know what to answer Him. ⁴¹ And He came the third time, and said to them, "Are you still sleeping and resting? It is enough; the hour has come; behold, the Son of Man is being betrayed/handed over into the hands of sinners. ⁴² Get up, let us be going; behold, the one who betrays/Hands Me over is at hand!"

¹⁴[An angel speaks to Daniel]: Now I have come to give you an understanding of what will happen to your people in the latter days, for the vision pertains to the days yet *future*.”

¹⁵When he had spoken to me according to these words, I turned my face toward the ground and became speechless. ¹⁶And behold, one who resembled a human being was touching my lips; then I opened my mouth and spoke and said to him who was standing before me, “O my lord, as a result of the vision anguish has come upon me, and I have retained no strength. ¹⁷For how can such a servant of my lord talk with such as my lord? As for me, there remains just now no strength in me, nor has any breath been left in me.”

¹⁸Then *this* one with human appearance touched me again and strengthened me. ¹⁹He said, “O man of high esteem, do not be afraid. Peace be with you; take courage and be courageous!” Now as soon as he spoke to me, I received strength and said, “May my lord speak, for you have strengthened me.”

Luke 4:1-14

Narrator: Jesus, full of the **A.** Holy Spirit, **B.** returned from the Jordan and was led around by the Spirit in the wilderness for forty days, being **C.** tempted by the **D.** devil.

1. Narrator: And He ate nothing during those days, and when they had ended, He became hungry. And the devil spoke to Him.

Devil: If You are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread.

Jesus: It is written, "Man shall not live on bread alone."

2. Narrator: And the devil led Him up and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time.

Devil: I will give You all this domain and its glory; for it has been handed over to me, and I give it to whomever I wish. Therefore if you worship before me, it shall all be Yours.

Jesus: It is written, "You shall worship the Lord your God and serve Him only."

3. Narrator: And he led Him to Jerusalem and had Him stand on the pinnacle of the temple.

Devil: If you are the Son of God, throw Yourself down from here; for it is written, "He will command His angels concerning You to guard You," and "On their hands they will bear You up, so that You will not strike Your foot against a stone."

Jesus: It is said, "You shall not tempt the Lord your God."

Narrator: When the **D.** devil had finished every **C.** temptation, he left Him until an opportune time. And Jesus **B.** returned to Galilee in the power of the **A.** Spirit and news about Him spread through all the surrounding district.

Luke 5:16 ¹⁶ But Jesus Himself would *often* slip away to the wilderness and pray.

Luke 22:39-46

Narrator: And He came out and proceeded as was His custom to the Mount of Olives; and the disciples also followed Him. When He arrived at the place, He spoke to them.

A. Jesus: **Pray that you may not be led into temptation.**

B. Narrator: And He withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and He knelt down and *began* to **pray**.

X. Jesus: Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done.

Narrator: Now an angel from heaven appeared to Him, strengthening Him. And being in agony He was **praying** very fervently; and His sweat became like drops of blood, falling down upon the ground.

B. When He rose from **prayer**, He came to the disciples and found them sleeping from sorrow, and spoke to them.

A. Jesus: Why are you sleeping? Get up and **pray that you may not be led into temptation.**

Luke 4:2-10

Jesus became hungry.

1. ³ And the devil said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread." ⁵ And he led Him up and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time.

2. ⁶ And the devil said to Him, "I will give You all this domain and its glory; for it has been handed over to me, and I give it to whomever I wish. ⁷ Therefore if You worship before me, it shall all be Yours." ⁸ Jesus ⁹ And he led Him to Jerusalem and had Him stand on the pinnacle of the temple,

3. and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, throw Yourself down from here;

Luke 22:54-62

⁵⁴ ...but Peter was following at a distance. ⁵⁵ After they had kindled a fire...and had sat down together, Peter was sitting among them.

1. ⁵⁶ And a servant-girl, seeing him as he sat in the firelight and looking intently at him, said, "This man was with Him too." ⁵⁷ But he denied *it*, saying, "Woman, I do not know Him."

2. ⁵⁸ Another saw him and said, "You are *one* of them too!" But Peter said, "Man, I am not!"

3. ⁵⁹ A man *began* to insist, saying, "Certainly this man also was with Him, for he is a Galilean too." ⁶⁰ But Peter said, "Man, I do not know what you are talking about." Immediately, while he was still speaking, a rooster crowed.

Luke 23:35-39

³⁵ And the people stood by, looking on.

1. And even the rulers were sneering at Him, saying, "He saved others; let Him save Himself if this is the Christ of God, His Chosen One."

2. ³⁶ The soldiers also mocked Him, coming up to Him, offering Him sour wine, ³⁷ and saying, "If You are the King of the Jews, save Yourself!" ³⁸ Now there was also an inscription above Him, "THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS."

3. ³⁹ One of the criminals who were hanged *there* was hurling abuse at Him, saying, "Are You not the Christ? Save Yourself and us!"
